PITCH UPDATE

The pitches are looking fabulous. They are in the best condition we've seen them in for many years. This is mostly due to the hard work of Hamish Norris and the funds we've secured from the Football Foundation, Maresfield Parish Council and Gatwick Airport Community Trust. We're in the second year of the six year improvement project. These efforts have been recognised in the latest Pitch Power report from the Football Foundation which rated all our pitches as "good" (we started with a rating of "basic").

This season Hamish has been regularly cutting the grass and using the turf grooming Quadraplay attachment. This, together with the reseeding and fertiliser applied last season, seems to have made a big improvement to the grass coverage, health of the grass and the drainage. We've only postponed three games so far this season - one because it was raining extremely hard (playing during hard rain cuts up the surface), one because of standing water (immediately after very heavy rain) and one because the ground was frozen.

We've just had the green vertidrained again. We will be fertilising and reseeding again in the Spring.

We want to be able to continue to maintain the pitches to a high standard after the Football Foundation grant has expired. We will find it difficult to afford vertidraining from a contractor. So our plan is to buy a slitter like the one shown below. This should allows to keep the pitches free draining. Once we've modified the storage at the pavilion to allow us to store a slitter securely, we will apply to the Football Foundation for funding (we will of course have to contribute a significant amount). We hope to do this by the end of this season.

We are holding our tournament on Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th July at Fords Green this year. Our plan is to run the following groups:

- Saturday 29th July U8 mixed & U13 mixed
- Sunday 30th July U10 mixed, U9 girls & U10 girls

Spreading the tournament over two days will allow us to finish each day around lunchtime / early afternoon and so avoid any very hot afternoon temperatures. It will also avoid any difficulties with parking that occur when changing over between morning and afternoon sessions.

VEO PURCHASE


Our coaches have been very eager to purchase a VEO camera. This is a camera designed specifically to record ball games. It will automatically track the ball, record the entire game and allow the game to be rewatched. This will have massive benefits for coaching and safeguarding (should we be misfortunate enough to experience any misbehaviour during a game).

We're very excited to announce that because of the generous donations of many people we are now in a position to buy this camera.
