OUR TOURNAMENT

Our annual junior football tournament was a huge success. We hosted about 400 players from 45 teams across four age groups. The weather was fantastic, the pitches looked superb, the food and drinks were great, but best of all was the welcoming and friendly vibe (this was a consistent theme in the feedback we received). On top of that we raised an amazing £3500! A massive thank you to all the volunteers - it would not have been possible without you. We've donated 10% of this total to local community groups. We'll be reinvesting the rest in equipment and facilities.



WILDCATS

Our other football offering is <u>Wildcats</u> which is our primary

school aged girls only sessions. These are drop-in sessions on Fords Green from 10 to 11am on Saturday mornings. They are going from strength to strength. We have a regular group of about 10 girls turning up. We have a huge amount of fun.

Donna and Diana, relatives of two of the regular girls, have very kindly done their DBS checks to provide cover should it be needed. Thank you very much to them.



PITCH UPDATE

The pitches are looking lovely. The Spring and Summer provided some excellent growing weather. We have the usual works planned for this season: grass cutting; grass grooming; vertidraining; fertiliser; seeding.

We did apply a selective herbicide called Holster in August. Hoslter is a safe amenity herbicide designed to be used in public areas like the Green. We were, and still are, reluctant to use chemicals on the Green. However, we felt that the plantains had got out of control. These are a broad leafed plant with a low lying habit that dodges the blades of the mower. They create large patches of shade that kill the grass. So with the agreement of the Fords Green committee and the Forest Conservators, and the encouragement of the Grounds Management Association, we employed a certified contractor to do the job. It has proved most successful. We hope that the standard cultural methods will now be sufficient to keep the plantains at bay.

QUICK PLEA FOR THE SEASON

It would be very helpful if you could please:

- be positive and encouraging towards the players and coaches (including the opposition);
- not coach your child from the sidelines as this may well confuse or contradict;
- wait until the day after the game to get in contact with the coach if you have an issue to discuss.

Coaches and committee members spend four or five hours a week for 30ish weeks a year on football. This is all done on a volunteer basis. We do it because we love it. The club tries to make football as accessible as possible by keeping the fees low. The coaches and committee members cannot do this all on their own. This has got to be a partnership with the players and parents. Coaches and the club will need help from parents / players to:

- ensure the players are on time to games and training;
- setup the pitches and break them down after home games;
- run the lines occasionally;
- volunteer for fundraising events;
- make themselves familiar with the club rules / policies set out on the Rules page of nutleyfc.co.uk/rules.html.

I realise that not everyone is going to be able to help on everything, some people will be working at weekends, some will already be volunteering lots of time for some other organisation, however, if you can lend a hand (eg setting up before or tidying up after a game maybe or at a fundraiser perhaps) then it would be most appreciated.

Thank you and I hope this makes sense and is acceptable.
